The novel follows a group of young adults as they try to come to terms with a friend's premature death. Ananke's early death rips a huge hole in the lives of her/his friends.

The novel is deliberately unclear about whether the characters are male or female, leaving the reader to decide. This device serves to draw the reader in to the interpretation of the story, and to involve us in the processes the characters are going through. Many beautifully descriptive scenes of the natural world are intertwined with the emotions of the narrator as they wrestle with their grief and memories.

**Anna Stern** was born in Rorschach in 1990 and lives in Zurich, where she writes and is completing a doctorate. She has previously published *Wild wie die Wellen des Meeres* (Salis 2019), winner of the *3sat Prize* at the Ingeborg Bachmann competition in Klagenfurt in 2018.



In *A House for Many Summers*, Axel Hacke writes about the magic of a place you don't necessarily have to be but where you really want to be. He tells stories of the people on an island, its landscape, of praying mantes, fakir pigeons, goats, olives, and a man shooting a wild boar from his marital bed. He writes of poems found stuck to street corners and the secrets of the Torre, an old tower that challenges its owners and occupants in ways they never expected.

These stories let you feel the summer heat, the sand underneath your feet, the gentle sea breeze. They invite you to let your eyes wander over olive groves and let your gaze rest on the world's most beautiful sunset but also on such peculiar questions as: what is it we're really doing when we're doing nothing?

All the things that can happen when you stop viewing a holiday destination simply as such, a place you go to and then leave behind – a backdrop for recreation – and instead take the place seriously and try to understand it. That's where the magic of this book lies and it's sure to have a lasting effect on its readers.

**Axel Hacke** is an author and columnist for the *Süddeutsche Zeitung Magazin* living in Munich. He's one of the most renowned authors in Germany and his books have been translated into 20 languages and sold over one million copies. His most recent publication was *Im Bann des Eichelhechts* (2021).



While Mao is propagating the "Great Leap Forward", "Grandmother" Guo is allowed to move to Neuberg Street in the so-called Harmony Village, a new and reasonably comfortable settlement on a hill at the foot of which lies the gigantic Dongshan steel factory, with her son and daughter-in-law. She is called "Grandmother" by the policeman out of respect, and she becomes the party secretary of Neuberg Street because no other party member lives there.

Guo's neighbourhood initiative is completely eclipsed by the "Great Leap Forward", which is intended to push steel production into new heights. Suddenly, even the hitherto passive neighbourhood housewives start building a blast furnace and melting steel. In the process, they compete with their husbands, who are workers at the steelworks, in setting a new production record, which is likened to launching a satellite into space.

Meanwhile, the steel melting sparks love, ignites the fire of political sentiment and sends the flames of destiny blazing into the sky. Wei Zhang's new novel is as colourful and multi-layered as a kaleidoscope, precisely observed and stirringly narrated.

**Wei Zhang** was born during the Cultural Revolution in Chongqing, People's Republic of China, where she studied English. In 2007, she published her first book, *Zwischen den Stühlen: Geschichten von Chinesinnen und Chinesen in der Schweiz* (NZZ Libro), followed by her first novel, *Eine Mango für Mao* (Salis), in 2018. *Satellit über Tiananmen* is her second novel. She also writes for the feature section of the *Neue Zürcher Zeitung* and teaches intercultural topics as a university lecturer.

How do we live and love, if the world is lost in chaos?

Germany in 1941: Hannes and Lisa live with their children on a secluded little farm in the quiet Elbmarsch area – their own little piece of land to grow their own little happiness. For a long time, they manage to stay out of the chaos that befalls the rest of the world. But they have to be careful, because a large part of the village population are followers of the Nazi-regime. Fear and mistrust are omnipresent – even the church visit leads to suspicions. In order to avoid those suspicions, Hannes spends his evenings drinking beer with the "right people". But Lisa knows what needs to be done.

In the second novel of his *Kronsnest*-trilogy, Florian Knöppler tells the thrilling story of a family that is in danger of breaking against the circumstances and chaos of their time.

**Florian Knöppler** was born in 1966 and studied Romance Languages, German, and Philosophy in Bonn and Bologna. Afterwards, he finished his education as an editor and worked for various radio- and TV-programs. He wrote newspaper reports, often about people with unique life-stories in the context of contemporary history. Now he is living with his family on a farm in Schleswig-Holstein, not too far away from the place his novels are set in – his debut novel *Kronsnest* (Pendragon Publ., 2021 – all rights available) as well as *Habichtland* (*Hawkland*).



A small circle of great thinkers under the Italian sun

A literary debut about the decisive turning point in Friedrich Nietzsche's thinking. A sensitive and at the same time humorous reflection on how people deal with the failure of great life plans.

1876: Friedrich Nietzsche, in his early thirties, plagued by recurring migraine attacks and an eye complaint, and tired of his professorship at the University of Basel, receives an invitation from the writer Malwida von Meysenbug to go to Italy. There he is to restore his health, pursue new works and promote the founding of a free academy for "young minds" with her.

Full of hope for the healing effects of the south, Nietzsche sets off for Sorrento accompanied by the philosopher Paul Rée and the student Albert Brenner. After a fateful encounter with Richard Wagner, who is also staying on the Gulf of Naples, all expectations seem to be fulfilled, but then the stay threatens to become a fiasco.

**Andrea Liesemer**, born in 1965, studied medicine in Muenster and worked as a doctor in a psychiatric clinic. She also attended lectures in German studies, comparative literature, Romance studies and philosophy. Today she lives in Munich. *Days in Sorrento* is her literary debut.

**Dirk Liesemer**, born in 1977, studied politics and philosophy in Muenster and Rennes, France. He attended the Henri-Nannen-School of Journalism in Hamburg and worked as an editor in Berlin and Munich. He now works as a freelance journalist for various magazines, including the magazine *mare*. Ava is 28 and works as a designer in an advertising agency. She finds the working environment increasingly exploitative and superficial, her life meaningless. It is only when she meets Lina that Ava breaks out of her lethargy. Lina takes Ava to connect, a community founded by the charismatic Dev. Their vision: a post-digital society in which people are closely connected. The more time Ava spends with this community, the more she neglects her work and distances herself from family and friends, who see connect as a dangerous cult. One day, Ava makes a radical life decision: she wants to dedicate her life exclusively to the community.

In her suspenseful debut novel, Thea Mengeler throws us into the abysses of interpersonal relationships and deals with the most topical issues of our time. How do we want to shape our lives? How urgent is the longing for community in a digitalised world?

**Thea Mengeler** was born in 1988 in Meerbusch and studied creative writing and communication design in Hildesheim, Kiel and Istanbul. She was a finalist at the 28th international open mike and lives in Krefeld as a freelance author and copywriter.

A woman between two men – that's the stuff great opera was once made of. Back in the day when men used to duel each other with all the tricks in the book. You can't expect that nowadays. But if it happens unexpectedly, then what?

The police think it's a bad joke when the psychiatrist Oskar B. Markov seeks out the station at Alexanderplatz to press charges because someone challenged him to a duel. Berlin has not seen a duel in over a hundred years. Blowing each other's heads off has become defunct as a cultural technique. But Markov won't let himself get fobbed off and insists on an investigation. So begins an adventurous grotesque leading to an antiquarian who has evidently lost all grip on reality over reading too many books on duels. He interpreted his ex-girlfriend's new relationship with the psychiatrist as a third-degree insult and to him, it's clear: there must be a duel. But how does that work? And what were they like back in the day?

In this vibrant novel, Rayk Wieland combines an absurd and entirely contemporary plot with the story of the very last duel held in Germany and creates suspense that doesn't ease until the very last page.

**Rayk Wieland**, born in 1965, studied Philosophy. He's an author and editor for the newspaper, radio and television living in Leipzig and Mecklenburg. He's published numerous articles and features in *Titanic*, *taz*, and *ttt - titel thesen temperamente*. From 1998 until 2009 he hosted the literary event *Toter Salon* in Hamburg together with author Gerhard Henschel. He published three volumes on *Desolate Places* (*Öde Orte* Bd. 1-3) together with Jürgen Roth as well as the novels *Ich schlage vor, dass wir uns küssen* (*I Suggest We Kiss*) and *Kein Feuer, das nicht brennt* (*No Fire Not Aflame*).



Before the tide carries it away, Geeske and her crew take it to Delfzijl in the Netherlands. This is where the problems begin: The dead man was German, and the place where he was found is in disputed border territory. While the dispute over jurisdiction escalates on both sides of the border and the questions surrounding the dead mudflat walker increase, the Federal Police See in Cuxhaven secretly sends an investigator to Delfzijl: Liewe Cupido, German by birth but raised on the Dutch island of Texel. His German colleagues call this headstrong, taciturn guy: the Dutchman. Who, if not he, could solve the case?



Berlin in November 1925: A corpse is found in a canal of the sprawling city. The victim is a journalist who worked for the Nazi-paper "Voelkischer Beobachter". As Ariel Spiro uses his rather dubious contacts in the capital's underground to find clues, his girlfriend Nike partakes in spiritual séances, which may reveal more than she anticipated.

Suddenly, the discovery of a boy's identification card, who was in contact with the deceased, provides a new lead. But the "Blond Dog", as the boy is called, has gone into hiding in Munich, and Spiro's investigations take him through the entirety of Germany.

**Kerstin Ehmer** used to work as a fashion photographer. Together with her husband, she runs the legendary *Victoria Bar* in Berlin since 2001. Kerstin Ehmer is the author of the longseller *Die Schule der Trunkenheit (The School of Sophisticated Drinking)*, which has been translated into several languages. With *Der weiße Affe (The White Monkey)*, she published her debut novel in 2017 (currently 4<sup>th</sup> print run), which marks the first case for Inspector Spiro. In 2019, the second case, *Die schwarze Fee (The Black Fairy)* was published by Pendragon Publ. – all rights are available for the series.

It has been only one year since Marie Vos started working with the EU's anti-fraud unit in Brussels. 

How we deal with a rising China will determine our future. There are two directions: technological isolation, political and military confrontation or cooperation. Europe needs to decide. This book provides information and analyses.

This book describes the changes in the complex Chinese society with its contradictions: developing country and affluent society, traditional agriculture and high-tech location, socialism and market economy, cosmopolitan and nationalist. The book outlines Chinese understanding of history, the economic and political everyday life, as well as ideas of Chinese interlocutors about modern-day China. The geopolitical conflict with the USA is highlighted. Recommendations are derived for business and politics in Germany as well as at the European level.

**Gerhard Stahl** was born in 1950, and has worked in the policy department of the German Federal Ministry of Finance and in various European institutions, including the role of Deputy Head of Cabinet for the European Commissioner for Economic and Monetary Affairs. He has been a university lecturer at the Peking University HSBC Business School in Shenzhen since 2014, and is also a member and advisor to EDUI, a Chinese environmental NGO. He lives in Brussels, Shenzhen and Berlin.

For two years, the world has now been dominated by the pandemic caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus. It has taken hold on all continents and in every region. It spread in multiple waves and formed ever new epicentres. It pierced through people's everyday lives, changed social dynamics, dominated the media, challenged the political establishment, and put numerous scientific disciplines to the test.

The physician and historian Karl Heinz Roth describes the events from a global perspective and goes back to the 2000s to explain their background. He analyses the spread and the dynamic of Covid-19 and discusses the pandemic's characteristics and its effects on humans. He addresses countermeasures and the failures that have come to light in the context as well as the mental, political, social, and economic consequences of the lockdowns.

In this book, the individual aspects of a global pandemic are examined from an interdisciplinary perspective, put into relation to one another and are contextualized for the first time. It allows for the discussion and resolution of controversial questions such as whether the virus escaped from a lab, the role of large international institutions, as well as questions on effects and collateral damage.

**Karl Heinz Roth**, born in 1942, holds doctorates in medicine and historical sciences and worked as a general practitioner in a joint practice until 1997. In 1986 he co-founded the *Foundation of 20<sup>th</sup> Century Social History* and has been a board member ever since. He authored numerous publications on work, medical, social, economic, and science history in the 20<sup>th</sup> and early 21<sup>st</sup> century.

And these are specifically psychological topics and issues. Thus, psychology can easily explain certain phenomena related to housing and furnishing, while also providing recommendations pertaining to these topics. Everyone can profit from architectural psychology, ranging from the design of your own four walls to professional engagement in the interior design field.

This is the sense in which the book *The Practice of Architectural Psychology – How Rooms Become Homes* by Barbara Perfahl was written. This title includes an introduction to architectural psychology and its most pivotal concepts, in addition to relevant recommendations, practical tips and instructions for the interior design and furnishing of apartments and homes. The results will not only be a visually beautiful home, but also an emotionally pleasing, feel-good space and retreat.

**Dr. Barbara Perfahl** completed her undergraduate psychology degree at the University of Vienna, and received her Ph.D. from the University of Leipzig. She advises individuals and companies on design decisions related to residential and commercial spaces within the framework of architectural psychology conclusions, and provides support to media outlets as an expert on residential questions.
